

8. Weight of dry antlers

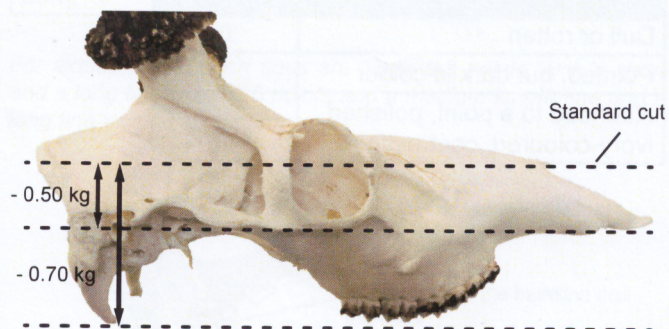


fig. 2-G: Weight deduction for entire skull with complete upper jaw is 0.70 kg or upper jaw with sanded down row of teeth is 0.50 kg.

When determining the weight of the antlers, the short nosed cut skull is regarded as the standard cut, with a small nasal bone and the path of the line through the centre of the orbital cavity. For antlers with a full upper jaw, the weight is 0.70 kg and is reduced to 0.50kg without the row of teeth (fig. 2-G).
