Check with a reputable and trusted reloading manual, such as Nosler, Hornady, Speer or others to verify the use of all reloading components, Either a standard LRM or Match LRM primer should work. Bullet type, weight and velocity will impact primer performance. Be Safe, Read and Research prior to proceeding.

There is no reason to use these unless you can't find standard large rifle primers. These will work but you'll want to work up to a new safe load. It will probably need slightly less powder. Accuracy might be a bit compromised. A good rule of thumb is to use magnum primers when your powder charge is greater than 60 grs.

Yes they can...BUT, anytime you change a component you cannot assume the load remains the same, even though it might. Use the seating depth you have hopefully predetermined best for your rifle and start with lowest powder charge listed in your chosen bullet manufacturer's load data manual and work up in small increments of powder, usually a third of a grain for 308. Watch carefully for signs of excessive pressure or excessive speeds. Although not an absolute necessity, a quality chronograph is a valuable tool in working up a load.


