Of course, different powders could chronograph differently using each type of primer. It will come down to testing the individual loads with the primer of choice to verify the load, like always.

It's best to use these primers with validated loading data that calls for them. Changing to a primer not specified will have an unpredictable effect on pressure. However, if the primer is the only component being swapped out, you can probable safely work up a load starting 10% below max and increasing in 1 grain increments. An example of the unpredictability of swapping out primers: I loaded several under-max .44 Mag cartridges using primers that were for 'Standard or Magnum' loads. Results: blown primers. I switched to a large magnum pistol primer and the load worked fine.

When I started reloading for my .300 Weatherby Mark V in 1998 I used Remington 9 1/2M as that was what was at the store.Not getting below MOA I switched to WLRM's and never regretted it. When I get a load fine tuned it will stay consistently sub-MOA with these primers. When groups have opened up I knew it was because of copper fouling usually. Action screws came loose once and once new scope ring screws loosened.Blue Loc-tite fixed those problems. WLRM's have not been a problem,always seated well,never a mis-fire, consistently sub-MOA and I shot my best buck ever with a round ignited by one! The only difficulty has been finding them lately.God Bless!


